Town of Mars Hill Responds to COVID-19

A lot has happened since the last issue of the MARS HILL **LETTER**. In February – remember February? – we were looking for an early spring and return of warmer weather. Since March, the coronavirus and COVID-19 pandemic has consumed the attention of people around the world.

Things in the era of COVID-19 may look differently, but here in Mars Hill and Madison County we have fortunately been spared the possibility of a large outbreak and community spread that some nearby areas have not. Early action by Madison County and town officials have played a large role in that outcome but you, the citizens, have heeded the advice of public health officials keeping our community safe.

The Town of Mars Hill responded to the global pandemic with a number of actions aimed to protect our citizens and We temporarily closed Town Hall, the employees. Recreation Park, and other Town facilities to limit potential exposure. However, the Town has been able to continue to operate with only minimal impacts to services. Our Public Works Department has continued to provide all services that are normally available without interruption. There has been a noticeable increase in the volume of garbage that has been collected. Our Police and Fire Departments are also continuing to operate at normal levels. They have adjusted their operating procedures to help limit direct contact with the public unless necessary. Importantly, the Otis Duck Greenway has remained open and available for your use...just remember to maintain appropriate social distancing to other users.

Have You Completed Your CENSUS 2020?

By now, you should have received your 2020 Census questionnaire. According to recent data, the response rate by residents of Mars Hill and Madison County lags well behind the state average. Your response to the Census is very important. Census results directly impact federal funding for our Town and county and representation at the state and federal level.

Take a few moments to complete your Census form online at https://my2020census.gov. It will take less than 10 minutes to complete if you know everyone's birthdate that was living in your house on April 1, 2020. Rather than having a Census Taker visit your home in June, or after depending upon the COVID situation, gather your information and take a few moments to complete your form today. Their goal is to count everyone only once, and in the right place. Federal law protects the confidentiality of all individual responses the Census Bureau collects.
